SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1) EVENT TITLE, DATE & VENUE

The event shall be known as the Mt Clarence Hillclimb, to be held on 1st June 2019 at Memorial Avenue, Mt. Clarence Albany Western Australia.

2) ORGANISATION AND STATUS

- a) The event shall be held under the FIA (Federation Internationale de l'automobile) International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), the Speed Event Standing Regulations, The Vintage Sports Car Club of WA 2019 Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations and instructions to competitors that may be issued. (If you require a copy of the VSCCWA Standing Regulations please contact the Entries Registrar or go to the VSCCWA web site)
- b) The event will be conducted in accordance with the CAMS Risk Management & Occupational Health and Safety Policies. These policies are available from the CAMS website www.cams.com.au.
- c) The event shall be a round of the VSCCWA Hill-climb & Sprints Championship.

3) INSURANCE

6) ENTRIES

- a) **Opening date:** On publication of these Regulations
- b) **Closing date:** 6th May 2019
- c) **Entry fee:** \$80.00 (Inc GST)
- d) **Entry lodgement:** VSCCWA. PO Box 7277 Spearwood WA 6163 or entries@vscwa.com.au.
- e) **Restricted entries:** The organisers will restrict entries to 60 participants and reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason therefore in accordance with NCR 83. A minimum of 35 entries is required for the event to proceed. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt.
- f) A parent or guardian of a competitor under 18 years of age must sign consent on the Entry Form.

7) VEHICLES

All Vehicles (open event) as per 2019 VSCCWA Standing Regulations for Sprint / Hill Climb Club Championship are eligible for entry and must comply with Schedule A & B of the current CAMS Manual. All fuel must comply with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual.

8) START/NUMBER OF RUNS

- a) All competitors are required to register at the Administration tent, located in the carpark at the bottom of the hill. Each competitor will be provided a "Start No" sticker which will allocate their starting position. The onus is on each competitor to make sure they have their allocated number of runs.
- b) Practice is scheduled to start at 0900hrs. Each competitor will be allowed one practice run which must not be driven at full competitive speeds. Practice times do not count for competition results.
- c) The event is scheduled to start immediately following practice. Each competitor shall have a minimum of 3

timed runs. **Additional runs may be under taken if time permits.**

- d) The event is scheduled to finish by approximately 1300hrs
- e) Event Organisers reserve the right to cancel, abandon or postpone the event in accordance with NCR 59 of the current CAMS Manual.

9) CLUB MEMBERSHIP

All nominated drivers must be a member of a CAMS-affiliated Club. An additional entry fee of \$50 applies for all entrants that are not members of the VSCCWA and have not entered the Albany Classic.

10) LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

Competitors must hold the minimum of a CAMS Level 2S or 2SJ licence. Applications for the Level 2 licences are to be made on line at the CAMS website www.cams.com.au

11) VEHICLE SCRUTINY:

All competitors must present for scrutiny, and all vehicles must be adequately muffled. At scrutiny your helmet must be presented for inspection and approval. Your CAMS Licence, Club membership and log book (CAMS or otherwise) must be produced at scrutiny and on request during the meeting. NO logbook at document check NO championship points. Competition numbers will be provided on the day. No car may participate unless it has passed scrutiny. Any car or driver may be prohibited from practice or the competition for safety reasons.

(i) City Competitors

Scrutiny will be held on **Saturday 18th May** between 0800 and 1100am at the North Metropolitan TAFE off Lloyd Street Midland.

(ii) Country Competitors:

Albany & Bunbury competitor's scrutiny will be held at a local venue and date as organised. Scrutiny will also be held on Saturday morning of the event from 0730 to 0900 hrs in the paddock at Mt Clarence.

12) DRIVERS' BRIEFING

A compulsory Drivers' Briefing for each group will be held in the pit/assembly area 15 mins before the scheduled commencement of the practice for that group. Any competitor failing to attend or arriving late at the Briefing should seek out the Clerk of the Course who will consult with the Stewards to determine whether they are permitted to run and under what conditions, e.g. reduced number of runs.

13) DETERMINATION OF WINNERS

The results, overall and for each eligible class, will be determined by the fastest overall time of the day not including the practice run and ranked in ascending order of time. Should two or more competitors record the same time the competitor next best fastest time shall be deemed superior. Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the current CAMS Manual.

14) USE OF PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty or penalties for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

15) PRESENTATION

Trophies will be awarded for the winners of each class as per the 2019 VSCCWA Standing Regulations and will be presented at the presentation dinner on Sunday night.
